

### **Early Admissions Program Regulations**

for individuals who entered EAP in Fall 2006 as first-year students

Continuation in the EAP and admission to the professional program is granted with the assumption that all pre-pharmacy courses will be successfully completed prior to entry into the Pharm.D. program. In order to continue in the EAP and begin the Pharm.D. program, students must:

1. Be continuously enrolled at OSU while in the Early Admission Program (continuous enrollment does not require attendance during summer term). All pre-pharmacy science courses must be taken at OSU. Exceptions may be granted by the Office of Student Affairs.
2. Maintain a pre-pharmacy science\* GPA of at least 3.00.
3. Earn a minimum cumulative OSU\*\* GPA of 3.25.
4. Successful completion of all pre-pharmacy required courses with a C or higher.
5. Pre-Pharmacy science courses may not be repeated to increase pre-pharmacy science GPA.
6. Adhere to the Student Life Policies and Regulations and the OSU Academic Regulations.
7. Begin the Pharm.D. program no later than three years after beginning pre-pharmacy course work (fall 2009).

EAP students must complete at least 36 credit hours each academic year (excluding summer courses, AP and/or transfer credits) with a minimum cumulative OSU GPA of 3.25. Letter grades of U, I, or N do not apply to the GPA requirements, nor do repeated courses or withdrawals. Review of your cumulative OSU GPA will be completed after spring term grades are posted for your first and second year. Your pre-pharmacy science GPA will be checked quarterly. Your cumulative OSU GPA and pre-pharmacy science GPA will also be checked at the end of the fall term of your third year (approximately one year before you begin the Pharm.D. program). Failure to achieve a pre-pharmacy science GPA of 3.00 or better in any two quarters will result in removal from the EAP and cancellation of your admission to the Pharm.D. program. Failure to maintain a cumulative OSU GPA of 3.25 will result in removal from the EAP and cancellation of your admission to the Pharm.D. program. Students are also expected to maintain continuous enrollment at OSU. If you anticipate an interruption of your attendance at OSU you must contact the College of Pharmacy immediately.
