Neurobiology of Addiction - Rachel Solotaroff, MD (UAN: 0036-9999-17-095-L01-P; CEUs: 0.1)

- Describe substance use disorders and persistent pain with a focus on Emotion, Reward, and Anti-Reward
- Discuss the alignment between the neurobiology of addiction and trauma
- Provide sample strategies for enhancing healing in addiction and persistent pain

Opioid Use Disorder Assessment and Diagnosis - Richard Gil, MD (UAN: 0036-9999-17-096-L01-P; CEUs: 0.1)

- Identify risk factors for, signs and symptoms of, and co-occurring disorders with opioid use disorders
- Describe how to diagnose opioid use disorders and risk stratify patients with chronic pain for developing opioid use disorders in primary care
- Describe the components of an opioid risk assessment for patients with chronic pain

Medication-assisted Treatment of Opioid Use Disorder - Todd Korthuis, MD, MPH (UAN: 0036-9999-17-097-L01-P; CEUs: 0.1)

- Identify rationale for using pharmacotherapy to treat opioid use disorders
- Identify effective pharmacotherapies for treating opioid use disorders
- Identify best practices for integrating opioid use disorder pharmacotherapy into clinical practice

Managing Pain in the Setting of Opioid Use Disorder - Eve Klein, MD (UAN: 0036-9999-17-098-L01-P; CEUs: 0.1)

- Recognize Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) in the setting of Persistent Pain (PP)
- List the options for treating PP and OUD
- Identify which treatments are indicated, depending on the presentation
