The Pharm.D./MBA Double Degree¹ is designed to enhance the business skills, knowledge, and practical experience of those students in the Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) degree program. The program is intended for those individuals who also seek careers that may lead to managerial and executive positions in the pharmaceutical industry and in health care delivery systems that provide pharmacy services to patients.
